- 1.Why Bridge Course: A bridging course is a university-preparation course with an academic curriculum and it is created to mature students as a means of preparing them for the intellectual challenges of a university education, successful completion of which is recognized as a basis of admission to the University. The course is designed to provide students with a solid foundation in the basic academic skills and knowledge they need to succeed in their college studies.
- 2.Duration: It should be offered over the minimum duration of one week or three hours for each subject.

- 3) Course curriculum: should be academic in nature and should use basic materials and provide instruction and ample practise. BMCCA will provide a complete revision of the subjects covered in higher secondary.
- 4) Nature: A course with a predominantly non-academic curriculum will not qualify bridge course.
- 5) Assignment of Grades: Grades must be based on demonstrated performance and students should be classified into
 - Excellent (above 80% of marks)
 - Good (60-80% of marks)
 - Average (40-60% of marks)
 - Below average (Less than 40%)

Responsibilities:

Bridge course is conducted for the First year students. The respective subject teachers take the corresponding subjects of bridge course and responsibility of conducting the test is with the first-year class- in- charges. On the basis of the test conducted, the students should be classified according to their grades and the grade list of the students should be forwarded to the Head of the departments.

On this basis the students should be given remedial and tutorial classes to enhance the their skill in that respective weaker subject. Additional support may be given through tutoring and mentoring programs which will help the students to understand the exploitation of new academic level and build confidence and develop new skills that will be helpful in their future.

Directive:

BMCCA shall act as a support system for new students offering interactive and dynamic learning opportunities and helps the students to develop a more well-rounded understanding of core concepts in the respective subject.
