


14. Workshop on Binary Accreditation

15. Workshop on Understanding and Fostering Psychological Issues of College Students




IQAC successfully conducted an online workshop on *Understanding and Fostering Psychological Issues of College Students* on November 14, 2024, at 1:30 pm. The event


19. Alumni Association Representatives' Meet

20. Workshop on Indian Knowledge System




21. 7-Day FDP for Non-Teaching Staff


22. Workshop on Indian Knowledge System – "Roots to Ropes: Discover Coir Magic"

40. Breaking the Taboos: Open Talk on Women's Health






41. Value Education Sessions

43. Raksha – Choose Dreams, Break the Chains of Drugs



46. World Cancer Day Observation


