#### **STATEMENT**

Bharata Mata College of Commerce and Arts (BMCCA), Choondy, Aluva recognizes the importance of providing Remedial & Tutorial classes to students which can help the slow learners to shore up their basic skills & advanced learners to inculcate research culture. This extra support can help them catch up to their peers & excel in their careers. It is a type of educational program which help students to improve & excel further in their studies.

The Remedial/Tutorial classes apply to all students enrolled in BMCCA.

### Remedial & Tutorial policy is guided by the following principles

## 1. Responsibility of the Tutor

- a) Conduct an internal test paper at the beginning of all semesters.
- b) Categorize all students based on the knowledge level as slow learners and advanced learners.
- c) Remedial classes are designed for slow learners and tutorial class for advanced learners.

#### 2. Remedial Classes

- a) **Purpose:** Focuses on helping students who are struggling or need extra support to grasp fundamental concepts, primarily designed for students who are below the expected level in a subject and need additional help.
- b) **Objective:** To improve student performance by providing additional guidance.
- c) **Approach:** Foundational topics will be addressed at a slower pace to support students who need help for achieving foundational competencies.
- d) Eligibility: Students who have low test scores, teacher recommendations or self-referrals.
- e) **Frequency:** Classes should be held bi-weekly and duration can be 30 to 45 minutes, scheduled after the class hours.
- f) **Feedback mechanism:** Use feedback to identify areas for improvement and to refine structure and frequency if needed.

### **TUTORIAL**

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### 1. Tutorial Classes

**Purpose:** Aims to enhance understanding/deepen knowledge often complementing regular classes and to inculcate research culture by offering more personalized attention.

- a) **Objective:** Increasing subject comprehension and building confidence.
- b) **Approach:** May cover more complex topics, advanced concepts or review challenging material offering a chance to engage with the material in more depth.
- c) Eligibility: Open to all students who wish to improve their understanding or seek additional support.
- d) **Frequency:** Classes should be held bi-weekly and duration can be 30 to 45 minutes, scheduled after the class hours.
- **e)** Feedback mechanism: Use feedback to identify areas for improvement and to refine structure and frequency if needed.

## 2. Structure to be maintained by the Tutor

- a) Each teacher should take a minimum of 2 remedial classes and 2 tutorial classes in a month.
- b) Time could be allotted to the faculty on rotation basis.
- c) Students who are advanced learners can also be roped in to help slow learners.
- d) A timetable for mentoring, remedial classes and tutor interaction may be made by the department and executed accordingly.
- e) The remedial and tutorial attendance registers should be maintained in the department and regularly updated.
- f) Record should be maintained separately for remedial and tutorial classes with the below mentioned details of the student.
  - i. Class & semester
  - ii. Course type: Core/complementary/common
  - iii. Title of the course
  - iv. Name of the teacher
  - v. Name of the students
  - vi. Date of remedial and tutorial class
- vii. Duration of remedial and tutorial class
- viii. Question papers discussed
  - ix. Signature of student
  - x. Signature of teachers
