SUSTHIRA BHAVISHYA: Harmonizing Progress with Planet through Sustainable Development Goals

OBJECTIVES

- To create awareness among students about the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- To embed sustainability principles into academic, co-curricular and extension activities.
- To promote eco-friendly behaviour and responsible citizenship among students and staff.
- To extend sustainability initiatives to the community through outreach programs.
- To develop a campus culture focused on environmental protection, social responsibility, and global well-being.

CONTEXT

To understand students' baseline awareness of sustainability and SDGs, the institution conducted a Google Form survey prior to launching *SUSTHIRA BHAVISHYA*. The aim was to assess their familiarity with Sustainable Development Goals and the United Nations 2030 Agenda. The survey included the following key questions:

1. Have you heard of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)?
2. Do you have an understanding of what the SDGs are?
3. Are you aware of the purpose behind the introduction of the SDGs?
4. Are you familiar with the United Nations 2030 Agenda?
5. Do you know how many SDGs are included in this approach of the United Nations?

The responses showed that while many students had heard of SDGs, only a limited number were familiar with their purpose, significance or the number of goals. This indicated a clear need to build structured awareness, provide hands-on sustainability experiences, and foster environmental and social responsibility both within and beyond the campus.


SDG Awareness Analysis Report

The survey assesses student understanding of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) across five key questions, revealing high basic awareness but significant knowledge gaps in specifics. Analysis of 15 sample responses shows awareness declining from 73.3% for basic familiarity to 20% for UN 2030 Agenda knowledge. Total responses in the full dataset exceed 100, primarily from S6 (final-year) students across commerce, BBA, BCA, BSW and BCF.




1. Have you heard of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) ?




2. Do you have an understanding of what the SDGs are?




3. Are you aware of the purpose behind the introduction of the SDGs?




4. Are you familiar with the United Nations 2030 Agenda?




5. Do you know how many SD Goals are included in this approach of United Nations?

Based on these findings, the college launched *SUSTHIRA BHAVISHYA*, a comprehensive model built on awareness, action, and outreach to foster a sustainability-driven campus culture.

THE PRACTICE

Level – 1: Awareness within Campus

- Introductory session on SDGs was delivered through the Value Education class, ensuring that all students received foundational awareness as part of their moral and personal development modules.
- Seminars and expert talks by environmentalists, healthcare professionals, and social workers.
- Programs related with environmental sustainability and human wellness.

Level 2 – Action through Practice

Under *SUSTHIRA BHAVISHYA*, the college translates SDG awareness into active engagement through campus-level initiatives that promote environmental protection, health, inclusivity, waste reduction, and community well-being.

A. Environmental Stewardship & Green Campus Initiatives

Aligned with SDGs **6, 12, 13, 14 & 15**, the college implements several ecological sustainability actions:

- Campus Canopy Programme to enhance green cover with native trees.
- Regular tree plantation drives across campus and local communities.

- Student-led sustainability projects, exhibitions, mini-projects and field-based initiatives.



- Curriculum integration of SDG-based projects.



